<b>Class Title:</b>	<b>Music</b>
<b>Subject:</b>	<b>Music</b>
<b>Class Description:</b>	<p>The student will continue to work on mastering an instrument or vocal skills. Student will be able to master skills in the following areas</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- identify the various parts of the instrument.</li> <li>- tune instruments on their own</li> <li>- identify, practice, and perform advanced chords</li> <li>- demonstrate rhythms within strumming, fingering or string patterns</li> </ul> <p>This class will work toward one or more of the Washington State music standards. This will be a year-long class, spanning the 2018-2019 school year.</p> <p>This course meets at least one The Washington State Music Education K-12 Learning Standards and if all requirements of this course are met, students can earn .5/ 1.0 credits this school year. 75 hours will complete a .5 credit and 150 hours or more will complete a 1.0 credit. <b>Learning Materials:</b>	Practice Log, instrument if being used and a music practice book as per needed and determined by the instructor.

<b>Learning Activities:</b>	<p>The student will complete a log with time spent and activities that support this class and verify the estimated hours per week.</p> <p>The student will provide the monthly log to his/her consultant each month.</p>
<b>Progress Criteria/ Methods of Evaluation:</b>	<p>Satisfactory or unsatisfactory progress will be based on participation and the amount of time spent in the activity. Keeping a log of exercise time and the activity carried out is a requirement and will be used to evaluate the progress of this course.</p> <p>[Student's name] will keep a log to present to consultant at face-to-face meetings each month. Monthly Progress will be marked satisfactory or unsatisfactory based on the professional judgment of the certified teacher using parent input and information recorded on the log.</p> <p>.5 credit will be earned for completing 75 hours and 1.0 credit will be earned for 150 hours or more.</p>
