Class Title:	Creative Writing
Subject:	Language Arts: Creative Writing
Class Description:	<p>Students generate a variety of texts on self-selected topics in a variety of categories, including the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • descriptive, comparative, and persuasive essays; • short stories and flash fiction; • narrative and lyric poems in both free verse and formal, structured formats; • technical writing; and • creative nonfiction. <p>In the course of the semester, students compile a portfolio of their work, as well as identifying personal goals and real-world applications for business or career. 2018-2019 school year.</p> <p>This class meets graduation requirements for the State of Washington and Kennewick School District, as well as meeting a range of Common Core Standards. This is a semester-long course for which students have the potential to earn a .5 credit. It is a skills-based class that may be repeated for credit.</p> <p>The estimated weekly hours for this course are 5 hours.</p>
Learning Materials:	Apex courses are an on line product and a complete curriculum. A working computer and internet connection is needed. Students may need to print off materials and work with the instructor during their monthly meetings.
